Annual Directory of Members and Sponsoring Companies

This publication has been the most popular sponsoring tool for many years. It is a comprehensive directory of the Executive Board, Committee Members, Chapter Principles and Bylaws, Chapter Members, and Sponsoring Companies. Members use this directory as a facility supplier and peer resource. Sponsoring Companies are offered several advertising methods in a "Yellow Pages" style section. A new feature of this publication is called "Project Showcase." This advertising opportunity allows Sponsoring Companies to submit a photo and project description. These submittals are reviewed and voted on by the Executive Board. The photo from the winning submittal is then used for the cover of the Directory and the masthead for AFE Twin Cities Chapter 13 website and newsletter. A full page description of the project is also featured on the inside front cover of the Directory. The cost to advertise in the Directory ranges from \$100-\$900.



Monthly Meeting Sponsorship

Sponsorship of a monthly meeting was rated the overall best value in a survey conducted in 2004. A monthly meeting generally consists of three components: 1) A plant or facility based tour for members 2) A related 30-45 minute presentation 3) Social Hour and dinner with all attendees. These meetings are held on the third Monday of the month from 5:00-7:30pm approximately 7-8 times per year. Cost ranges from \$750-\$1500 depending on attendance and dinner/social arrangements. Included with sponsorship is a full page ad in our monthly newsletter. If you are interested in sponsoring a monthly meeting, please contact the Programs Chairperson from our Executive Board. Preparations for these events is planned six months to one year prior to the event, so please contact us well in advance.



Lucky 13 Golf Tournament

The "Lucky 13" Golf Committee organizes an annual golf tournament at the beautiful Hudson Country Club. Held on the third Monday in July, the tournament brags that it has never been rained on since its inaugural event in 1989. Use ink to put this one on the calendar. Representatives from sponsoring companies have the opportunity to invite plant managers for an great 18-hole round of golf played in a scramble format. There are long drive, closest-to-the-pin, hole-in-one, and some...*non-traditional* contests to keep the day exciting. Golf shirts, towels, and beverages are also available for sponsorship. Lunch, and a wonderful dinner provided by the famous Pork-O-Call, and prizes are all included. Participation cost is \$90-\$110. Hole sponsorship cost is \$275. Shirt, towel, and beverage sponsorship ranges from \$500-\$3000. Proceeds from the event help fund the Student Scholarship Program.



Newsletter Sponsorship

AFE Twin Cities Chapter 13 publishes a newsletter approximately ten times per year. The newsletter features meeting details, certification and educational information, community events, and current events. It is distributed to approximately 250 plant managers and 150 facility industry suppliers. Typically a 1-2 page advertisement is submitted and inserted into the newsletter. The cost for one month is \$150.

Certification & Recertification

The Association for Facilities Engineering offers its Certified Plant Engineer, Certified Plant Maintenance Manager, and Certified Plant Supervisor programs at selected cities across the country. All programs require certain levels of education and/or experience for eligibility and completion of an application.



The CPE program provides a standard of competence for facilities engineers and managers. Its curriculum covers

civil engineering, economics, management, environmental engineering, safety, maintenance, mechanical engineering, HVAC and electrical engineering.



The CPMM program debuted in 1999 to provide a standard of professional competence for maintenance managers and to enhance the status of this field as a unique discipline and profession.

It is built on the success of the CPE program. The curriculum consists of the following sections: maintenance management, preventive maintenance, inventory and procurement, work orders - work flow/planning and scheduling, CMMS, training and work cultures, predictive maintenance, reliability centered maintenance, total productive maintenance, maintenance financials and return on investment.



The CPS review program has been designed for the supervisory professional or

those aspiring to fill the ranks of supervision.. Our uniquely designed curricula guide you through the most relevant materials to ensure maximum retention for the plant/facility supervisor. Basic supervision requires individuals understand and can exhibit what to do in the face of change, effective communication skills, how to empower employees, and how to enable them to develop the confidence to overcome the daily challenges they face.
